



Matthew 11:25-30




# Context: Setting The Stage

Jesus has just finished condemning his generation for rejecting John the Baptist.

He then warns the cities that have rejected Him and His works that they will be judge harshly.

Jesus changes His tone as He invites all those who are listening to come and find rest in Him.



### Questions

- 1. Question What <u>time</u> is this passage talking about? \*think context
- 2. What things have the Father hidden?
- 3. Who are the wise and the infants?

### Question #1

- What time is this passage talking about? \*think context
  - ▶ Jesus had just denounced the cities that had rejected Him - so the time was immediately following His curse upon the nations



### Question #2

- What things have the Father hidden?
  - That Jesus was the Messiah all of the "so called" wise men of Jesus' age, could not fathom that a carpenter was truly the Son of God

### Question #3

- Who are the wise and the infants?
  - The wise were the religious cities which rejected Him Jesus using sarcasm
  - The infants are the common people or the non-religious cities that accepted Him
- Many of the common men (infants) followed Jesus whereas the cities that were religious (wise) were too proud to realize that Jesus was the Messiah.




### 1 Corinthians 1:18-21

- <sup>18</sup>For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but it is God's power to us who are being saved.
- <sup>19</sup>For it is written: I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and I will set aside the understanding of the experts.
- Where is the philosopher? Where is the scholar? Where is the debater of this age? Hasn't God made the world's wisdom foolish?
- God through wisdom, God was pleased to save those who believe through the foolishness of the message preached.


### 1 Corinthians 1:22-25


- <sup>22</sup>For the Jews ask for signs and the Greeks seek wisdom,
- block to the Jews and foolishness to the Gentiles.
- 24Yet to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ is God's power and God's wisdom,
- <sup>25</sup>because God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.







Jesus Son Of God

# Main Point

### Re-read...

- <sup>25</sup>At that time Jesus said, "I praise You, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because You have hidden these things from the wise and learned and revealed them to infants.
- <sup>26</sup>Yes, Father, because this was Your good pleasure.
- Let 27 All things have been entrusted to Me by My Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son desires to reveal Him.
- 28"Come to Me, all of you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.
- <sup>29</sup>All of you, take up My yoke and learn from Me, because I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for yourselves.
- 30For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."




#3 - Turning Knowledge Into Wisdom

# Whose Yoke Are You Under?

You might find yourself tired and depressed because you are not yoked (submitted) to Jesus, but to your own selfish desires.

Stress, spiritual restlessness, and depression often come when you try to find fulfillment apart from Jesus and His word.



### 3 Yokes - 3 Roads



#### Yoke #1 - Yourself

You try to find peace in pleasing yourself (from making more money, bigger better vacations, nicer things) but this road will leave you restless, depressed, and in need.

### Yoke #2 Good Works


You think you can please God by doing good works (giving money, time, sacrifice) in order to gain favor from Him. This road will leave you burned out, empty and confused.

### Yoke #3 - Jesus

You place your faith in Him, and follow His commands. Your motive is love and thankfulness. This road will find you satisfaction and joy even in the midst of troubles.

### Dr. David Jeremiah says:

"When believers take Jesus' yoke, they place themselves under His dominion. Only then do His followers enjoy the day-to-day release from stress that God intended."
